Dr Karel (Karl) Nolles did his PhD in economics and engineering at the University of NSW (Sydney) and George Mason University (Washington DC), and was Senior Research Fellow and a founding Director of the UNSW Centre for Energy and Environmental Markets from 2004 to 2006 and an Adjunct Senior Lecturer in energy economics at the University of Sydney from 2007 to 2014. He has recently been appointed as a Visiting Professor with JGSEE.

From 2007 to 2013 he was a Director in the Climate Change and Utilities business of Macquarie Bank / Macquarie Capital, during which time he was responsible for deal origination, execution and asset management regarding a range of Macquarie Bank investments and advisory mandates related to electricity markets, clean technology, carbon trading, water trading, and other environmental products. He represented Macquarie as a Director on the boards of a number of Macquarie invested companies, including Envex, NextGen, The Waterexchange, and Climate Friendly, and was seconded from Macquarie for most of 2012 to be the Managing Director of the NextGen electricity brokerage business.

In 2019 he was Manager Electricity Reform for the Power and Water Corporation of the Northern Territory of Australia, where he was intimately involved in developing new systems and procedures for managing the real challenges faced by electricity utilities managing an influx of renewable energy into a grid not designed with this purpose in mind.

He has recently taken the position of Chief Investment Officer with Yamanah Investments, a specialist venture capital fund based in Sydney, and maintains a keen interest in developments in the electricity markets, as well as personally being an investor in / advisor to a number of startups in the "energy transformation" space.
